

## Role play (act out) going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

- Two people take a sheet. One reads the part of the priest, the other reads the part of the Penitent (the person who is confessing).
- Read the page through. This is good practice for going to confession.

Be sure to take home the sheet that says "The Sacrament of Reconciliation - "How to do it". This will help you prepare at home.



## ROLE PLAY - CONFESSION--RITE 1

Good morning. I'm glad to meet you. Priest:

Penitent: Good morning Father, I'm a little nervous about this since I've never come to the

Sacrament of Reconciliation before.

There's no need to worry. I'll help you with anything you forget. The main thing we Priest:

want to remember is that God is here present with us.

Let's begin by making the Sign of the Cross together and taking the words very

seriously. Listen now while I say this prayer:

Loving Father, you are with us. We trust in your mercy and beg you to

open our minds and hearts to you truth and love.

What sins have you thought about sharing today? Share with me a couple things that Priest:

you'd really like to improve on.

Penitent: - I've been fighting with my older brother just about everyday. He's always

got the TV on the wrong channel.

- I get lazy at home and don't do my chores and then my mom gets upset with

- At school I find myself picking on this girl that sits next to me.

It's good that you are able to admit this. I agree with you, it is very difficult to like Priest:

everyone, but Jesus reminds us in His Gospel "to treat others as we want to be treated." God knows we try very hard to obey all his commandments, but you mentioned that the one about obeying your mom gets really tough. Really, try to get to

your chores right away. In fact, for your penance, I'd like you to start doing your

chores before your Mom asks you to.

Now, I'll ask you to express your sorrow for all your sins by saying an Act of Contrition, Priest:

either one you know, or one from your heart.

Priest:

Penitent: My God I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more. Our sevice Tesus Charast suffered and died forus. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen Now, I will lay my hands on your head and give you the Church's prayer of forgiveness

called Absolution:

God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sin; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins. In the name of the

Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Penitent: Amen.

The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go now and live in Christ's peace. Priest:

Penitent: Thank you Father. Good-bye.

Return to the pew and say a prayer of thanks to God for forgiveness. Pray your penance.
